The Holiday Season

With the holidays fast approaching, please remember that they can be fun and festive for people, but for pets they can also be dangerous. Here are some tips from the AVMA to help you ensure that your pet has a happy and safe holiday season, with an emphasis on Halloween safety:

- Holiday food, in addition to any junk food or table scraps, should not be fed to your pet. Be especially careful with Halloween candy and chocolate, as they can be toxic to your pet.
- Don't leave your pet unattended outside on Halloween. Halloween pranks committed against pets can be vicious, & black cats are particularly at risk.

- Keep pumpkins and other holiday decorations out of reach of curious noses and paws. Pets may knock over a lit pumpkin or decoration and cause a fire. Birds can accidentally fly towards a lit pumpkin and get hurt. Scented candles and incense can also be harmful to the respiratory health of your pet.
- Consider keeping your pet in a separate room, away from the door, when trick-or-treaters arrive. Strange people in even stranger clothes can frighten some pets.
- When answering the door for visitors, make sure that your pet does not suddenly head outdoors. In case your pet does escape, make sure that it is wearing proper identification at all times.
